2015 BC Child Poverty Report Card

Stats (low income families, based on the low-income after tax measures, 2013):

Campbell River:

- ⇒ 23% poor children 0 17 years old 1570 (16% in 2006)
- ⇒ **26%** children 0-5 years old 570 poor children

Strathcona Regional District:

 \Rightarrow 24.5% of children 0 to 17 years old

The lone-parent family income is lower in Campbell River (\$30,256) than in BC (\$42,610) or Island Health (\$40,914).

Campbell River had a higher teen mother rate (54.4 per 1,000) compared to BC (27.1 per 1,000) and Island Health (39.0 per 1,000).

Living Wage on Cortes Island—\$16.29 (2014)

The minimum rate of pay earned by two adults working fulltime to meet the basic needs of the house-

This document outlines a few key indicators with updates from the 2014 Campbell River State of the Child Report.

Higher rate of children in need of protection, rate per 1,000 children aged 0 to 18 years -- 23.5% (CRVIW) - compared to 6.4% (BC) 12.1% (Island Health).

Higher percentage of male lone parent families in Campbell River (8.2%) than BC (5.7%) or Island Health (7.0%).

Food Costing 2015

- Food insecure children may have poorer academic outcomes and social skills compared to children who do not experience food insecurity
- Food insecure children have poorer general health
- Child hunger is an independent risk factor for depression and suicidal symptoms in adolescence and early adulthood.

An increase of \$37 from 2013

5068 visits from children 1 – 17 years in 2015 at the local food bank
